
#### Visits Can Change Lives (reflection from October sermon)



### Health Minute

In this edition of Health Minute, I'll discuss organic versus nonorganic produce. Hate to admit it, but going to the grocery store is getting to be like doing a Junior High Science project! Be informed; be aware of what you are consuming! When you buy produce that is not organic you have no idea what it has been sprayed with as far as pesticides are concerned. If you think all the pesticides that are being sprayed on food have had long-term studies as to the potential effect on humans, think again. Pesticides have been linked to numerous diseases, hormonal dysfunctions, ADD and ADHD, migraine headaches, and growth/developmental delays. In his book "Make Food Simple" Dr. Livingood (Dr. of natural medicine and DC) states a study in the Journal of American Agriculture and Food Chemistry found that organically-grown fruits and vegetables have higher levels of cancer-fighting antioxidants than conventional pesticide-sprayed produce.

There are 12 foods that you should always buy "organic "because their skin is thin resulting in absorbing higher levels of pesticides. Included in the dirty dozen are: strawberries, spinach, kale,(collard, mustard greens), nectarines, apples, grapes, bell and hot peppers, cherries, peaches, pears, celery, and tomatoes.

Fruits and vegetables that have tough skins, therefore can repel pesticides and are safer to buy nonorganic are the following: avocados, pineapple, onions, papaya, frozen sweet peas, asparagus, honeydew melon, kiwi, cabbage, mushrooms, cantaloupe, mangoes, watermelon, and sweet potatoes.



Of course, the best produce is the produce you grow in your own garden or buy local when possible so you can ask questions about what you are getting. See ya in church! Jeff
